Context

A review of the Attendance Board was completed in response to the Premier's 2015 directive to review all Agencies, Boards and Commissions.



The need for change

- Less than 22% of cases heard by the Attendance Board resulted in significant change to school attendance
- A student centred and solution focused approach to addressing student attendance is needed.




What <u>else</u> do we know?

- Absenteeism is an early indicator that a student may be experiencing difficulty in their life.
- Students engaged in learning enjoy coming to school and feel positive about the future.
- Attendance is strongly connected to school success.
- Disengagement can lead to attendance issues.



- Renewed referral form




OSAR Mandate

The Office of Student Attendance and Re-Engagement provides leadership and support to school authorities and, when necessary, access to the Attendance Board.



Attendance: Pyramid of Intervention





Universal Strategies to Support Attendance



Tracking Progress — monitoring attendance data is the key to early identification of chronic or increasing absenteeism



Student Engagement — creating a culture of learning that engages students and increases school attendance





Successful Transitions — understanding and planning for transitions



Collaborative Partnerships — providing access to a variety of activities and services supports student attainment, self-confidence, motivation and attendance



Positive Connections — in order for students to experience success, positive connections must be created and maintained between school staff, the student and their family



A Community Conference is....

- a meeting of people impacted by student absenteeism
- facilitated by a trained person
- a discussion of the root causes and impacts of the absences
- a forum in which all parties seek a solution that is agreeable to all



Access to the Attendance Board

- Office of Student Attendance and Re-engagement provides operational and administrative support to the Attendance Board.
- When all reasonable efforts to improve attendance have been made at the local level, the school authority may refer the matter to the Attendance Board.
