make specific observations about any of the categories...the categories served as prompts....e.g. do I want to comment on management? Where the kids engaged? etc.

We offered what we called Speedy PD sessions after school where staff presented for 30 minutes(ish) on areas of strength/expertise/learning to help teachers who may struggle with certain areas.
