The Fearless Organization

The fearless organization was written by professor Amy C. Edmondson of Harvard Business School. The book, based on almost 30 years of research, is all about psychological safety in the workplace. Edmondson highlights the concept of psychological safety within organizations and teams. This much praised book is based on years of in-depth research. With many convincing practical examples and scientific substantiation, it shows that a company can only make real progress when employees feel free to discuss their plans and ideas and dare to express their concerns openly.
