Hailing from the Buffalo Lake Métis Settlement, Darla has spent the past twenty years sharing her deep love for Traditional Métis Fiddle music while infusing it with her own vibrant, modern twist. Darla has carved out a unique space in the music world, blending cultural preservation with innovative artistry.

Darla's musical journey has taken her from local stages to some of the most prestigious events around the world. She has graced the stages of the Edmonton Folk Music Festival, the Newport Celtic Rock Festival, and the legendary Mardi Gras in New Orleans, captivating audiences with her electrifying performances. Her role as a performer extends beyond the music scene, making her theatre debut at the prestigious Stratford Festival in 2024 for the world premiere of The Diviners, a production that placed Indigenous narratives at the forefront.

Performing regularly with Edmonton-based Country band Justin Sutton & North of 49, Darla is a versatile artist who can effortlessly transition between musical genres, all while staying true to her Métis roots. Over the years, she has had the honor of opening for prominent artists such as Snotty Nose Rez Kids, Gary Allan, and The Road Hammers, further solidifying her reputation as a dynamic performer.

Darla's impact extends beyond live performances. She has been featured on major media platforms, including APTN and CBC Radio, and her discography includes albums like From Feel to Flare and Bowing to Tradition, which showcase her dedication to both tradition and innovation. Her work has earned her numerous accolades, including the MSGC Arts & Culture Award in 2023 and the Young Woman of Vision Award from Grant MacEwan University in 2010.
