- SAIT is committed to equitable access through flexible delivery models.




SAIT's Youth Engagement Strategy

SAIT's Youth Engagement Strategy

Focus Area 1: Dual-Credit Programs

Action A.4:

Continue to explore flexible delivery models of dual-credit offerings to foster participation by students in rural or remote communities.

Outcome/Impact A.4:

Allow for more equitable access to SAIT programming for students in rural, remote, and reserve communities.

This strategy is institutionally recognized and reinforces SAIT's commitment to increasing access to post-secondary pathways for youth, no matter where they live.



Case Study Examples

Meeting High Demand with Creative Solutions

- Culinary is one of SAIT's most requested dual-credit programs.
- However, it has limited capacity on SAIT's main campus.
- Remote delivery allows us to expand reach while maintaining quality.
- SAIT instructors to deliver SAIT curriculum and content
- Academic Chair's visit kitchen to assess usability

Stoney Education Authority

Mînî Thnî Community School

- Two block weeks throughout the semester (full days for a total of 10 days)
- Students complete:
 - Intro to Cooking (Fall)
 - Intro to Baking (Winter)
- SAIT instructor contracted, with travel time and mileage included
 - Food supplies/materials purchased by foods teacher

Expanding access to students on reserve through flexible block scheduling

Banff Community High School

Canadian Rockies Public Schools

Banff Community High School

- Students from both Banff Community High School and Canmore Collegiate participate
- One full day per week for 10 weeks
- Program delivered by a SAIT-hired local Red Seal Chef
 - no travel required by SAIT instructors
 - food purchased locally by instructor

Community-based instruction provides local expertise and sustainability



Strathmore High School

Golden Hills School Division

Strathmore High School

One full day per week for 10 weeks

- SAIT instructor contracted, with travel time and mileage included
 - Food supplies/materials purchased by foods teacher

Remote delivery brings industry-experienced instruction directly to students



Palliser School Division

Multiple High Schools

Palliser School Division - Exploratory

- One full week of delivery split across two high schools:
 - Mon/Tues at School A
 - Wed/Thurs at School B
- Students travel between locations to participate
- Includes a campus visit to SAIT's Culinary facilities
- SAIT instructor contracted, with travel time and mileage included
 - Food supplies/materials purchased by SAIT instructor

Flexible exploratory model introduces culinary skills and postsecondary pathways



Key Benefits

Equitable Access

Reach more students regardless of location.

Industry-Relevant Skills

 Students build practical culinary skills with guidance by red-seal SAIT chefs and bakers

Pathway to Post-Secondary

Students earn both high school and SAIT post-secondary credit.

Flexible & Scalable

Model can be adapted for other high-demand programs.



Looking Ahead

- Continue exploring other programs for remote delivery.
- Strengthen partnerships with rural and remote schools.
- Expand access to life-changing learning experiences across Alberta.
