TAVE Committee

The TAVE Committee met on on December 2, 2025 to continue advancing its shared vision of inspiring Alberta's youth to explore skilled trades and technologies as meaningful and rewarding career pathways.

The Committee is advancing CASS' work on three Alberta Education Conditional Grant priority actions:

1. Research Study - Exploring Alberta **Students' Perceptions of Success Related** to Grade 12 Transition Plans

A province-wide research study examining students' perceptions of the essential conditions that support successful career decision-making, quided by the TAVE Framework.

Exploring Career Thinking: When do students begin thinking about their future careers?

Engaging in Career Thinking: How do students perceive their success in identifying and aligning potential career pathways? **Experiencing Career Thinking:** How do career-related experiences contribute to more informed thinking about their future?

The research proposal has been updated to include a sample parent message to support school authority communications. Survey dates were adjusted to November 18 -December 18, 2025 in response to the recent labour disruption, and members discussed strategies to encourage strong participation across jurisdictions.

2. Alberta Skilled Trades and Technologies **Summit 2026**

Planning is progressing for the *Alberta Trades*

& Technologies Summit 2026: Pathways to Possibility-Inspiring Alberta Students' Futures, at the Southern Alberta Institute of Technology(SAIT) on April 28 and 29, 2026.

The Committee discussed priorities for the 2026 Summit and provided advice on updated themes, potential keynote and panel contributors, and strategies to elevate industry partners by outlining their workforce priorities to help shape student learning experiences that reflect authentic sector needs.

To support ongoing coordination, a five-member Summit Subcommittee was established, consisting of Sean Lougheed, Jason Kupery, Christy Filgate, Rozlynn Wick, and Colleen Symyrozum-Watt.

3. Enhancing Career Pathways for Alberta's **Youth Through Dual Credit**

Development of a Dual Credit eLeadership Guide to provide system leaders with clear guidance, information, and tools to support dual credit programming across Alberta.

The Committee reviewed the eLeadership Research Plan and received an update on the approved submissions that will inform the development of the Dual Credit eLeadership Guide. Submissions were received from Chinook's Edge School Division in partnership with Olds College, Buffalo Trail Public Schools, St. Albert Public Schools, High Prairie School Division, and the Central Alberta Collegiate Institute (CACI).
